

We also need 6-7 people to help with set-up and pack down.






DELIVERING CHRISTMAS PUBLICITY

FUEGO, FUEGO! THERE IS FIRE IN THE BUILDING...HOLY FIRE.

We had our fire drill at the 10.15am service last week. There are always lessons to learn. Much of the preparation and training allowed it to go largely to plan. Thanks to all involved.

Maybe this is an allegory for something else God is calling us into.

But in this case, the fire is not something we are seeking to get safely away from, to save ourselves. Instead it's something to welcome in, to enter us and fire us up – ablaze for God – a Holy fire.

Our current series is over half way, where we have been considering the question posed by Jesus regarding gifts from God – literally the Charisma – the gift of the Holy Spirit. How much more is he willing to give?

And we know from the picture painted in Acts 2 of the day of Pentecost that the coming of the Holy Spirit, poured out on those present, is symbolised by flame – fire upon them. Fire in the bible cleanses and purifies.

³ He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and they will bring offerings in righteousness to the Lord. ^{[a] 4} Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years. (Malachai 3:3-4)

There is a story about a Christian group that visited a silver manufacturer. As the group watched the silversmith at his trade, smelting the silver in the raging fire, one asked "How will you know when it is ready, when it's pure?"

"When I can see my face in it", was the answer.

And that may be an allegory of what Holy Spirit fire does – it makes the creator's face to shine from us – that's when the work is done!

As we have progressed through topics recently such as "How much more does the Father want to give of the Holy Spirit?" to "Faith" to "Worship" and most recently "Confession and Repentance", we can see two things:

- 1. There is always more of God if we would receive; and
- 2. To be filled by his Spirit is the normal way of the disciple

We see this in the early church and we see it is the norm in churches that are fired up for God. Churches where more is experienced – of filling, healing, prophecy and powerful intercession. Lives transformed and people giving their lives to Christ, convicted and fired up themselves.

There is always more of God. In his timing and in his way.

It comes with a simple prayer – **Come Holy Spirit.** And an obedience to what he might say to us and do with us if we are open to receive the "how much more" he wants to pour out.

That is the principle we have dipped our toes into and that is the basis of the Third Service.

A time has come and is now for Christ Church to immerse, to go deeper (think Ezekiel 47...).

As preparation for tweaks to our services in 2026 I am **recommending a book to read** – through Advent or at your own leisure and pace – which explains this experiential spirituality in gentle and wise ways. It is "*The Familiar Stranger*" by Tyler Staton. He is the Senior Pastor who took over the church in Portland where John Mark Comer led before he stepped aside to dedicate himself to being a Teaching Pastor.

It is an intensely practical book filled with encouragement and challenge. It does not over hype (in fact quite the opposite) but neither does it under play. It is as honest about the failures as the successes, the lows and the highs. And each chapter will make you think – "wow I never thought of it like that!"

But this book makes one big assumption.

This is for you! – if you want to receive.

I commend it to you.

My prayer is that it will make you hungry for more of God's Spirit in your life and in the church.

It was Manuel who shouted "Fuego, Fuego" and Basil who told him "No , is no fire, is only drill".*

God is not calling us to a drill but to the real thing – his Spirit fire falling on us – for his purposes and his glory.






ADVENT READING RECOMENDATION:

SAFEGUARDING AT CHRIST CHURCH

A reminder of the Safeguarding Principles we introduced in 2023:

SAFEGUARDING PRINCIPLES

Everyone protects boundaries and vulnerabilities by reporting.



Safeguarding principles

- **1. EVERYONE:** Everyone is the eyes, ears and heart of a safe **church**
- **2. PROTECTS:** *Safe Church* intends to protect the vulnerable and the innocent and put off the perpetrator
- 3. BOUNDARIES: Safe Boundaries are key if in any doubt, ask first
- **4. VULNERABILITIES:** Power imbalance is always part of abuse that's why we particularly safeguard children and vulnerable people
- **5. REPORTNG:** Report don't solve or investigate
